Eligibility:

- You must be an academic school district or school (public, charter, parochial, private) located within the 50 United States offering a music education program. After school programs are not eligible for participation.
- Only one application per district or school. You cannot apply as a school if your district applies. You must complete the entire application. Incomplete applications will not be included in our final review.
- This application is designed to be completed by applicants who are familiar with their school or district's music education program and have access to district or school data. To prevent duplicate entries, districts and schools should assign ONE PERSON to complete the application.
- All applications must be submitted by January 31, 2026.

Please address each application question as honestly, thoughtfully, and completely as possible. To ensure the integrity and reliability of the award, the data analysis process was developed by WolfBrown, an esteemed independent research and evaluation firm specializing in education and the arts.
